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

















ηυ	eta + upsilon	no English equivalent like eu in feud but holding the sound somewhat longer	
οι	omicron + iota	oi as in oil	οιλ (oil)
ου	omicron + upsilon	ou as in soup	σουπ (soup)
υι	upsilon + iota	wee as with uee as in queen <i>OR...</i> wih as with ui in quick	κυιν (queen) κυικ (quick)
